Great Dixter

- ◆ Parts of the house date from 1450
- ◆ Sold to Nathaniel Lloyd in 1910 for £6000.00
- ◆ The grounds were laid out by Edward Luteyns
- ◆ The property upon the death of Daisy Lloyd was left to their son Christopher Lloyd who died in 2006.
- ◆ The gardens are now run by a trust.










Standean

Standean

- ◆ Built between 1892-1894 for the Beale family.
 - ◆ The house was the work of Philip Webb and friend of William Morris.
 - ◆ The grounds are 12 acres and include a croquet lawn, kitchen garden, bamboo garden, goose green and orchard.

Nymans Garden

- ◆ Involved three generations of the Messel family
 - ◆ The gardens were developed in earnest beginning in 1895 under the direction of James Comber.
 - ◆ Most of the main house was destroyed in a fire in 1947
 - ◆ Was bequeathed to the national trust in 1954.

Polesden Lacey

- ◆ The estate was formed in 1747.
 - ◆ It had 6 owners until it was given to the National Trust in 1942.
 - ◆ Developed in the landscape style with a combination of long walks and herbaceous borders.

Tresco Abbey Gardens.

- ◆ The gardens began in 1834 under the direction of Augustus Smith.
- ◆ They were further developed from 1872-1918 under the direction of T. A. Dorrien-Smith
- ◆ Today the gardens are maintained by the R. A. Dorrien-Smith, the great, great grandson of T. A. Dorrien-Smith













The Royal Horticulture Society

Wisley

RHS Wisley

- ◆ Purchased in 1878 by G. Wilson , former treasurer of the RHS.
 - ◆ Given in perpetuity to the RHS trust by Sir Thomas Hanbury in 1903.
 - ◆ In 1903 the garden was 6 acres.
 - ◆ Today the gardens are about 250 acres.
